

Policy: SDA Conflict of Interest - Choice and Control



Inclusive Housing Australia provides houses for people with disability to call their home.



The NDIS calls these types of homes Specialist Disability Accommodation or SDA for short.



NDIS means the National Disability Insurance Scheme.



IHA wants to make sure it respects your right to have choice and control over your life and the way you live in your home.



IHA wrote a policy to tell its staff about this called SDA Conflict of Interest – Choice and Control.



A policy is a set of rules written to tell IHA staff what to do and to tell you what to expect.



The SDA Conflict of Interest – Choice and Control policy tells IHA staff they must always act in your best interest and disclose any conflicts of interest.



A conflict of interest can happen when a staff member tries to act in the best interest of someone else when they should only be acting in your best interest.



This could mean the staff member is doing something that is better for another person or company than it is for you.



IHA has a responsibility to manage any conflicts of interests.



IHA will make sure you know what service it provides and what services are provided by another company.
